Lilja Alfreðsdóttir is Iceland's Minister of Education, Science and Culture and former Minister for Foreign Affairs and External Trade. Ms. Alfreðsdóttir is also a member of Parliament.

Before her participation in politics, Ms. Alfreðsdóttir served as Deputy Director of the Central Bank of Iceland's General Secretariat and International Affairs Department. Since her graduation from Columbia University, Ms. Alfreðsdóttir, has been a central banker, apart from temporary secondments to Iceland's Prime Minister's Office as a Special Liaison and previously, to the International Monetary Fund's Nordic-Baltic Executive Office as an Advisor.

Ms. Alfreðsdóttir holds a master's degree in International Economic Policy from Columbia University and received a Fulbright grant during her studies. She holds an undergraduate degree in Political Science from the University of Iceland. She also studied at the University of Minnesota and Ewha University in Seoul. Ms. Alfreðsdóttir has written numerous articles on economic and educational affairs in Icelandic papers and international journals. In addition, Ms. Alfreðsdóttir has held presentations on economic affairs in the United States and Europe.
